# SALE PERMITS



- ◆ Family Oriented Events
  - \$50.00
  - Premarital socials
  - Weddings
  
- ◆ Charitable Fundraisers and Organization functions
  - \$100.00

# SALE PERMITS



- ◆ Community Events 1 – 199 units of liquor
  - \$250.00
  
- ◆ Community Events 200 – 399 units of liquor
  - \$500.00
  
- ◆ Community Events 400 units of liquor or more
  - \$1,000.00

# CHANGES TO PUBLIC AND MLCC STAFF



- ◆ Liquor Marts/Liquor Vendors are no longer required to calculate additional fees for sale permits
- ◆ Same process to apply for a sale permit or no sale permit
- ◆ No refund of additional fees for returned product
- ◆ 1-888-898-6522 (MLCC) A toll-free line has been implemented in the Permits Department to support the public applying for a permit and/or store/vendor staff taking applications

# Private Occasional Permit Functions



- ◆ Issued to individuals
  - ◆ family and friends may attend
- ◆ Issued to non-profit organizations
  - ◆ members and guests may attend by invitation or advance ticket purchase

# No-sale Permit Functions



A no-sale permit may be issued to an individual for the following occasions:

- ◆ Wedding reception/social
- ◆ Bridal shower
- ◆ Family reunion
- ◆ Birthday celebration
- ◆ Gathering following a religious ceremony

# Sale Permit Functions



A sale permit may be issued to an individual for the following occasions:

- ◆ Wedding reception/wedding social
- ◆ Bridal shower
- ◆ Family reunion
- ◆ Charitable fundraiser

**A sale permit will not be issued for a birthday party**

# Permits Issued To Corporations



A no-sale permit may be issued to a corporation for the following occasions:

- ◆ A business meeting
- ◆ A grand opening of a business

# Permits Issued To Non-profit Organizations



A sale or no-sale permit may be issued to a non-profit organization for the following occasions:

- ◆ An organization function
- ◆ A convention
- ◆ A graduation party
- ◆ A charitable fundraiser
- ◆ A tournament, festival, cultural event or exhibition

# Public Occasional Permit Functions



- ◆ General public may attend
- ◆ Issued for:
  - ◆ community events
  - ◆ provincial events
  - ◆ charitable events

# Raffles



**A raffle with liquor as a prize may only be conducted if:**

- ◆ **It is licensed by the Manitoba Lotteries Corporation**
- ◆ **Entrants are eighteen years of age or older**
- ◆ **The liquor prize is not kept on the premises under the occasional permit**
- ◆ **The liquor prize is not presented to the winner on the premises under the occasional permit**

# How to Register Your Organization



- ◆ Submit copy of
  - ◆ constitution or by-laws
  - ◆ membership list
  - ◆ minutes of last three meetings

# Hours



- ◆ Liquor service shall not commence prior to 11:00 a.m.
- ◆ Liquor service must cease at 1:00 a.m. unless restricted by the banquet hall or MLCC
- ◆ 60-minute tolerance time to 2:00 a.m.

# Hours



- ◆ A maximum of four days for tournaments if there is a beverage room or cocktail lounge in the community
- ◆ A maximum of seven days for tournaments if there is no licensed premises in the community
- ◆ No permits issued on Good Friday

# Advertising Permit Functions

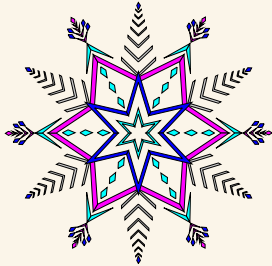


- ◆ Private functions cannot be advertised
- ◆ Private registered organization functions may be advertised to members and invited guests
- ◆ Public functions may be advertised

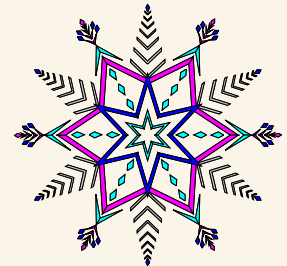

# Selling Price of Liquor



- ◆ \$2.25 minimum price for:
  - ◆ 28.4 ml (1 ounce) spirits, liqueur
  - ◆ 341 ml (12 ounces) beer, cider/cooler
  - ◆ 142 ml (5 ounces) table wine
  - ◆ 56.8 ml (2 ounces) fortified wine
  
- ◆ **Price printed on permit must be price charged at function**

# How Much Liquor is Allowed



- ◆ 20 units of liquor per 100 adults
  
- ◆ A unit of liquor is:
  - ◆ one bottle containing not more than 750 ml of spirits
  
  - ◆ 24 bottles or cans of beer, coolers, or ciders, each containing not more than 355 ml, or
  
  - ◆ 3000 ml of table wine

HOMEMADE BEER AND WINE IS NOT ALLOWED

# Banquet Hall Owners and Operators



- ◆ Banquet hall must be inspected for use under occasional permit
- ◆ Requirements issued to new banquet halls
- ◆ Education and Training

# Control Measures



- ◆ Hall rental agreement
- ◆ Hall representative must be in attendance
- ◆ Identifiable security
- ◆ Serve food and a variety of non-alcoholic beverages
- ◆ Trained bartenders

# It's Good Business Responsible Training



- ◆ Manitoba Tourism Education Council offers the IGB Server course
- ◆ Inspectors are available to do on-site staff training of the It's Good Business server program to organizations and banquet hall operators
- ◆ Recommended that banquet halls have a representative complete the IGB Server course
- ◆ Not currently mandatory for banquet halls
- ◆ Awareness of potential liability situations that exist with service of liquor

# Control Measures



- ◆ Two drinks per person
- ◆ No ticket sales after function has started, and definitely not at the door
- ◆ Checking identification
- ◆ Don't announce last call
- ◆ Designated Driver program

# Proof of Identification



- ◆ Government-issued photo-identification is mandatory as proof of age for the purchase of liquor
- ◆ The following are acceptable:
  - ◆ valid driver's licence
  - ◆ Manitoba Identification Card
  - ◆ MLCC photo-identification card
  - ◆ armed forces identification card
  - ◆ Canadian citizenship card
  - ◆ valid passport
  - ◆ Indian Affairs Status card
  - ◆ valid Canadian Firearms licence

# It is an Offence to:



- ◆ Sell liquor to an intoxicated person
- ◆ Sell liquor to a person under the age of 18 years
- ◆ Purchase liquor if under the age of 18 years

These offences carry a fine of up to \$1,260 for a first offence

# Limit your Liability



- ◆ Liability insurance
- ◆ Hall rental agreement
- ◆ Know the rules - read the conditions on the permit, pick up a brochure at a liquor mart/vendor
- ◆ Training - we are ready, willing, and able to help
